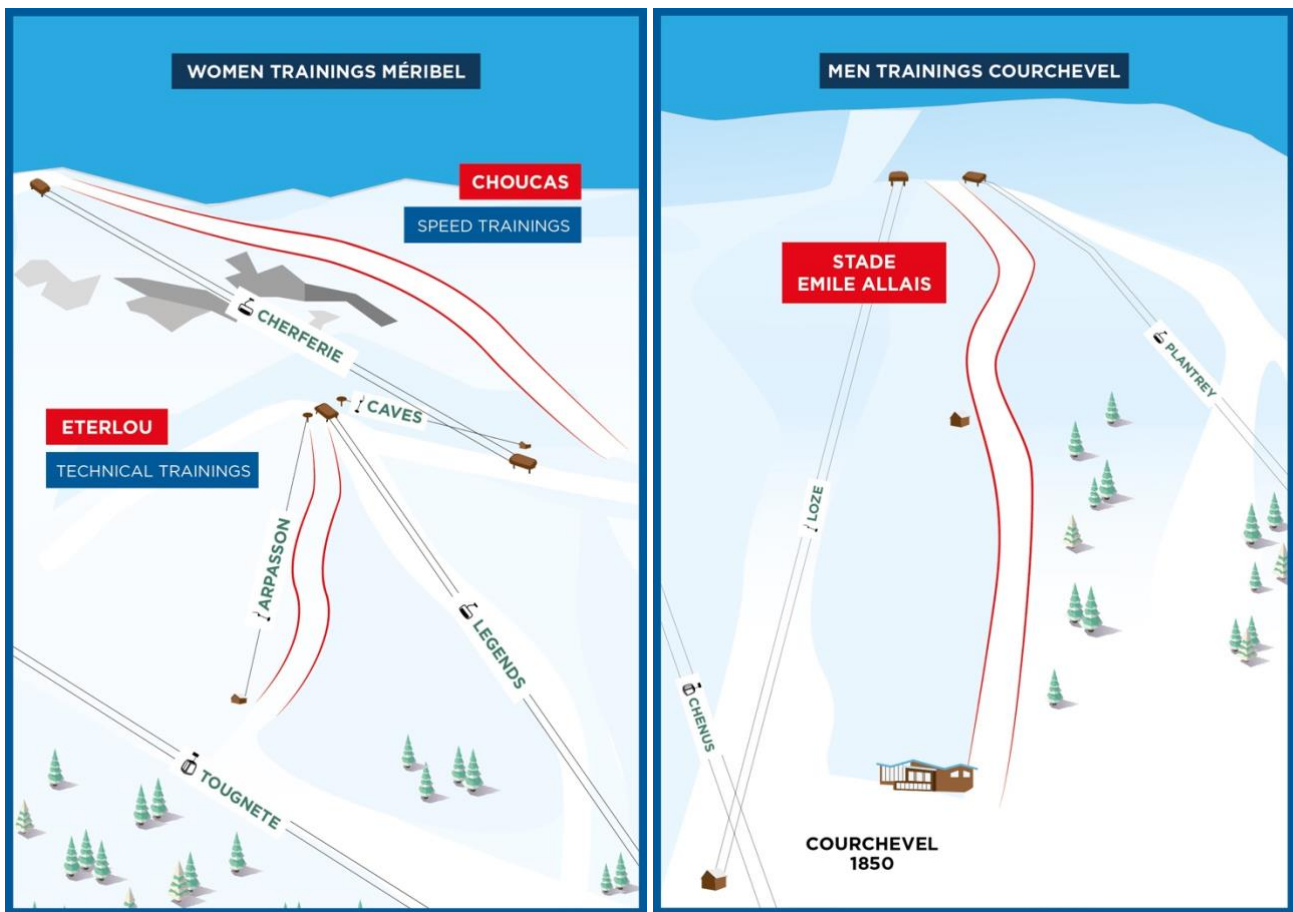
5.2. QUALIFICATION RACES

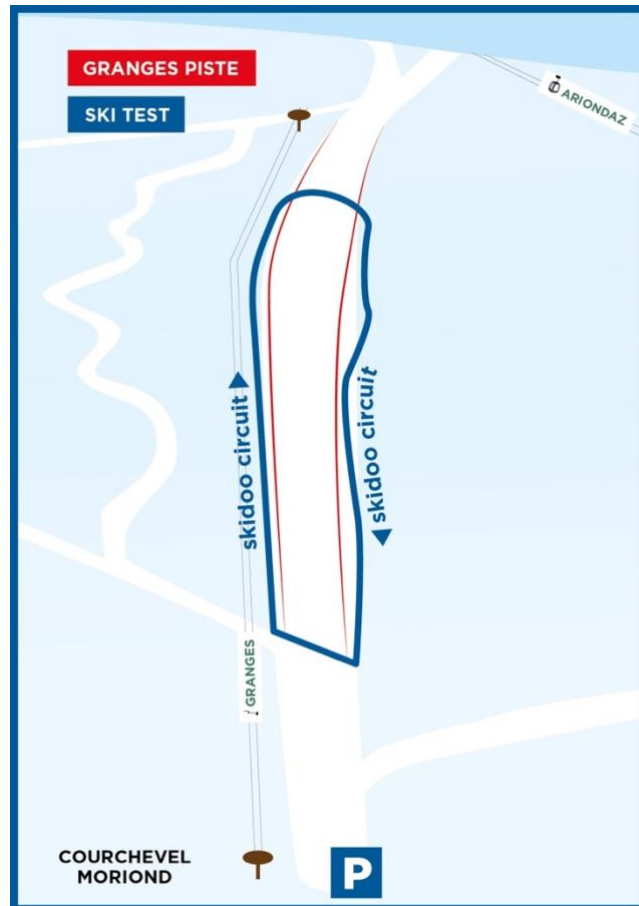
5.3. TRAINING

Training slopes for women are located in Méribel: Choucas piste for speed training and Eterlou for technical training.
Training slopes for men are located in Courchevel 1850: Stade Emile Allais.
Details will also be discussed at team captains' meetings.



5.4. SKI TESTING

The ski testing slope for men and women will be located in Courchevel Moriond 1650. The Organizing Committee will communicate the official dates and opening times in a further email.

6. FIS ALPINE WORLD SKI CHAMPIONSHIPS RULES

6.1. ELIGIBILITY AND CITIZENSHIP OF THE COMPETITORS

8. To be eligible for entry in FIS World Championships the competitor must be a citizen of the nation of which National Ski Association he has a license and prove this with a valid passport (ICR 203).

6.2. NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS AND OFFICIALS

9.1 The maximum number of participants from each nation and the qualification levels shall be:

9.1.3 No more than 24 competitors with a maximum of 14 of either gender in the Alpine events plus the competitors according to art. 9.3.

Minimum requirements:

Slalom/Giant Slalom: FIS points in one of the five disciplines (DH, SL, GS, SG, AC) on the valid FIS points list.

Downhill/Super G/Alpine Combined (with Downhill): Maximum 80 FIS points in the event according to the valid FIS points list.

Alpine Combined: A maximum of 160 FIS points in the event according to the valid FIS points list and a maximum of 80 FIS points in Downhill are required.

Parallel Events: Maximum 140 FIS points in one of the five events (SL, GS, SG, DH, or AC) on the valid FIS points list.

6.3. NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS IN EACH INDIVIDUAL EVENT

9.2 In each individual event no more than 4 competitors per National Ski Association plus the competitors according to art. 9.3, are entitled to start.

9.2.2 Downhill: A maximum number of 6 athletes may take part in the official training in each event plus competitors according to art. 9.3

9.2.3 Mixed Team Parallel: Maximum number of Nations allowed to participate at the Mixed Team Parallel is 16. The best 15 nations on the World Cup Nations Cup standings after the last World Cup race prior to the FIS Alpine World Ski Championships are automatically qualified for the Mixed Team Parallel. If the host nation is not in the best 15 nations, it is qualified as the 16th nation.

If 15 (or less) automatically qualified nations from the World Cup Nations Cup standing are entered (including the host nation), the nation(s) with lowest PWSL (Parallel World Seeding List) ranking, based on the calculation made by adding PWSL ranks of the best four (4) athletes (two (2) women and two (2) men) entered for the Mixed Team Parallel will have the possibility to start until there are 16 nations entered.

The regulations for the Mixed Team Parallel are published on the FIS Ski Website under: “Rules for the Mixed Team Parallel”.

9.3 The reigning FIS World Champion/s has/have the right to participate at the next FIS World Championships in the event/s they won, in addition to the team quota, under the condition they are entered by the same National Association (this is valid only for the individual competitions and not for the team competitions). If however the World Champion/s is/are also entered for other events, he/she must be included within the overall team quota.

6.4. TEAM OFFICIALS

9.4 The maximum number of team officials, medical and technical personnel per national team shall be:

9.4.2 Number of officials (per gender)

Up to 3 competitors	3 coaches	2 physicians*	2 technicians
4 or 5 competitors	4 coaches	2 physicians*	3 technicians
6 to 14 competitors	5 coaches	2 physicians*	4 technicians

*Medical personnel includes physicians, physiotherapists, etc.

The figures of up to 14 competitors per gender applies to all nations. The quotas include the national team officials (team captains, etc.).

The LOC will provide accommodation for female athletes from the 04.02.2023 until the 19.02.2023 and for male athletes from the 05.02.2023 until the 20.02.2023.

9.4.4 Transferable accreditations for Team Officials up to 50% of the above number of team official accreditations may be exchanged during the Championships in order to accommodate different coaches and support staff in the different events. The accreditation card of the departed official must be returned to the LOC in exchange for a new one.

Access passes to the Team and Restricted Areas will be provided to the teams to distribute internally, based on the above quotas.

9.4.5 Each nation may register its President and Secretary General with the team entry for each of the disciplines.

9.4.7 Extra Officials (per gender)

Up to 3 competitors	3 extra officials
4 or 5 competitors	4 extra officials
6 to 14 competitors	5 extra officials

The LOC does not assume any responsibility for organizing accommodation or meals for further additional officials.

9.4.8 National Ski Association Special Guests (per gender)

Up to 3 competitors	3 special guests
4 or 5 competitors	4 special guests
6 to 14 competitors	5 special guests

9.5 Access to the competition courses

Access to the competition course(s) is defined by the Jury and communicated at the team captain's meetings. Persons granted access to the competition course(s) and restricted areas shall be provided with an additional access card or other agreed identification.

NB: Should the FIS make any change to the above-mentioned rules, the new rules will automatically be implemented by the LOC.

6.5. DEADLINES FOR ENTRIES

Entries will be accepted from the Ski Association of each country in accordance with the FIS quotas and rules.

Please submit team entries through the FIS Online Entry System at www.fis-ski.com. National Ski Associations must submit their team numbers and names according to the FIS Alpine WSC rules.

Given the different calendar from previous WSCs, the LOC has no benchmark for number of rooms and dates of arrival/departure of the teams. Therefore, we ask all NSA to send a draft of the rooming list based on the above race calendar to the following email which is now the one to be used for any subjects related to NSA accommodation: accommodation-nsa@courchevelmeribel2023.com. This will not be considered an official entry list but will help the LOC to find the best solution for every NSA.

Please provide the following information:

- number of athletes, officials, other staff divided in team gender;
- number of rooms needed - single rooms according to rules;
- reliable dates of arrival/departure (even if not official);
- number of service men and workstations;
- estimated number of vehicles.

6.6. ANTI-DOPING AND MEDICAL RULES

14.1 If any question or protest arises as to the gender of the athlete, FIS shall assume responsibility for taking the necessary steps to determine the gender of the athlete (ICR art. 221.4)

14.2 Anti-doping control of all events is compulsory

14.4 The FIS Anti-Doping Rules compiled in accordance with the World Anti-Doping Code define all by-laws concerning anti-doping controls.

The LOC will provide accommodation for male athletes from the 05.02.2023 until the 20.02.2023.

Any lodging arrangements outside of the above dates are the sole responsibility of the National Ski Association. As such, if your team is planning to arrive before the official arrival dates, plan on arranging your own: accommodation, meals, transportation, lift tickets, ski rooms and storage, etc.

NOTE: If an athlete is competing in two non-consecutive races, the accommodation is due only for the dates of the single events; the period between the two events is at NSA charge (ex: SG MEN (09.02) and GS MEN (17.02): the LOC will pay 7 nights).

7.3. TEAM MEALS

Lunch and dinner will be provided at the team hotel, even though some hotels may provide dinner outside their building at a reasonable walking distance.

7.4. TEAM PARKING AT THE HOTEL

Teams will have parking lots available at the hotel or nearby. Nevertheless, they will remain limited. We kindly ask you to come with as few vehicles as possible to avoid any parking difficulties as well as to adopt an approach of corporate social responsibility.

7.5. TEAM PAYMENT DEADLINES AND TERMS

Payments include lodging, additional meals, wax cabin rental, and ski testing as reserved by each team or ski company.

Changes are permitted to be made to the reservation until November 6th, 2022 (art. 13.2 Preliminary team entry).

17.5.5 Before January 16th, 2023 (13.3.1 Provisional team selection), a National Ski Association may change their accommodation reservation by a maximum of 20% of the total nights without payment of a penalty (additional requirements are subject to availability).

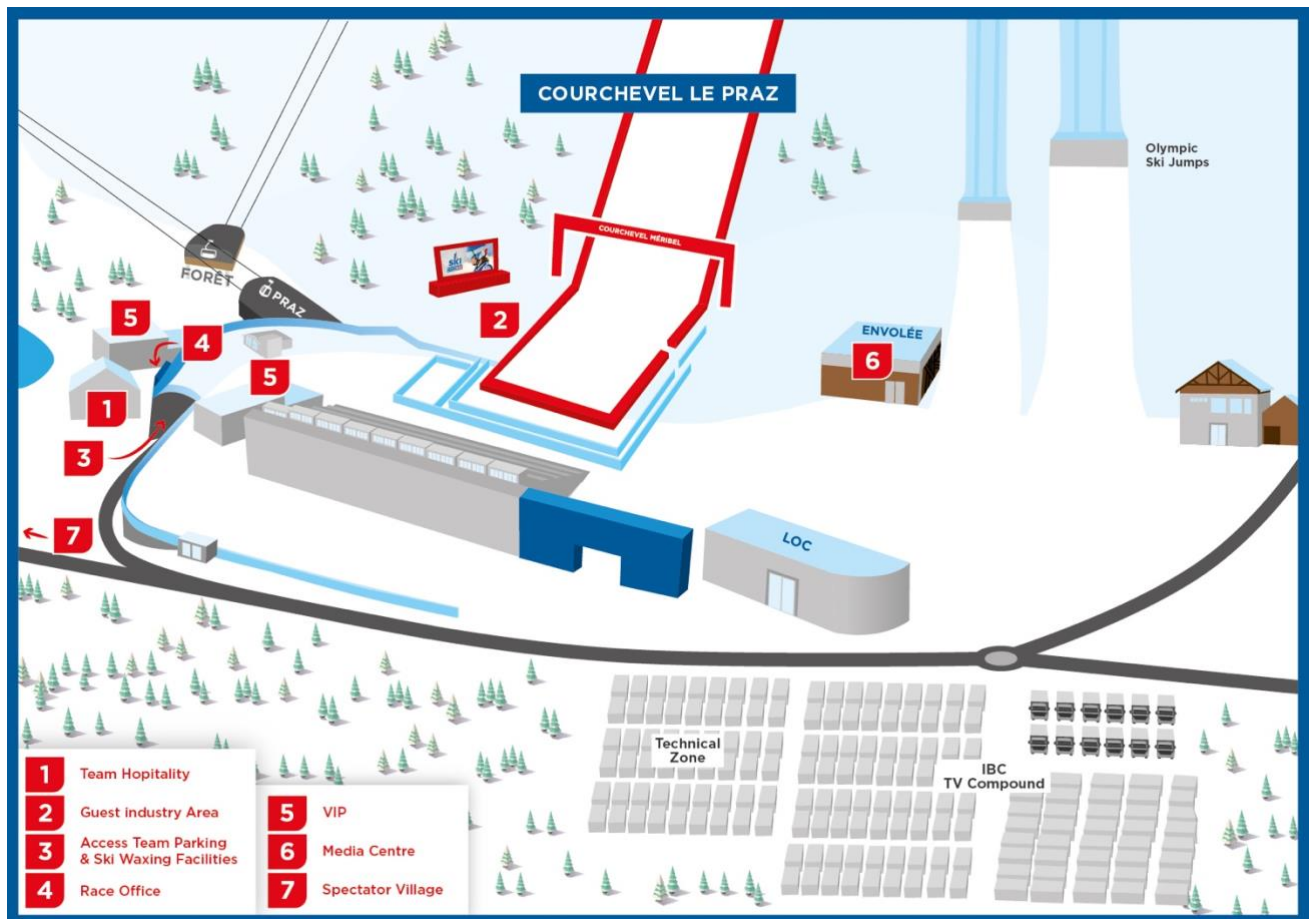
The Organizing Committee's terms for payment of accommodation will apply to athletes not qualified for free accommodation, additional periods for qualified athletes, as well as for team officials.

If this information is not communicated by the published deadlines before the Championships, the Organizing Committee has the right to invoice the costs incurred for cancelled accommodation to the National Ski Association concerned.

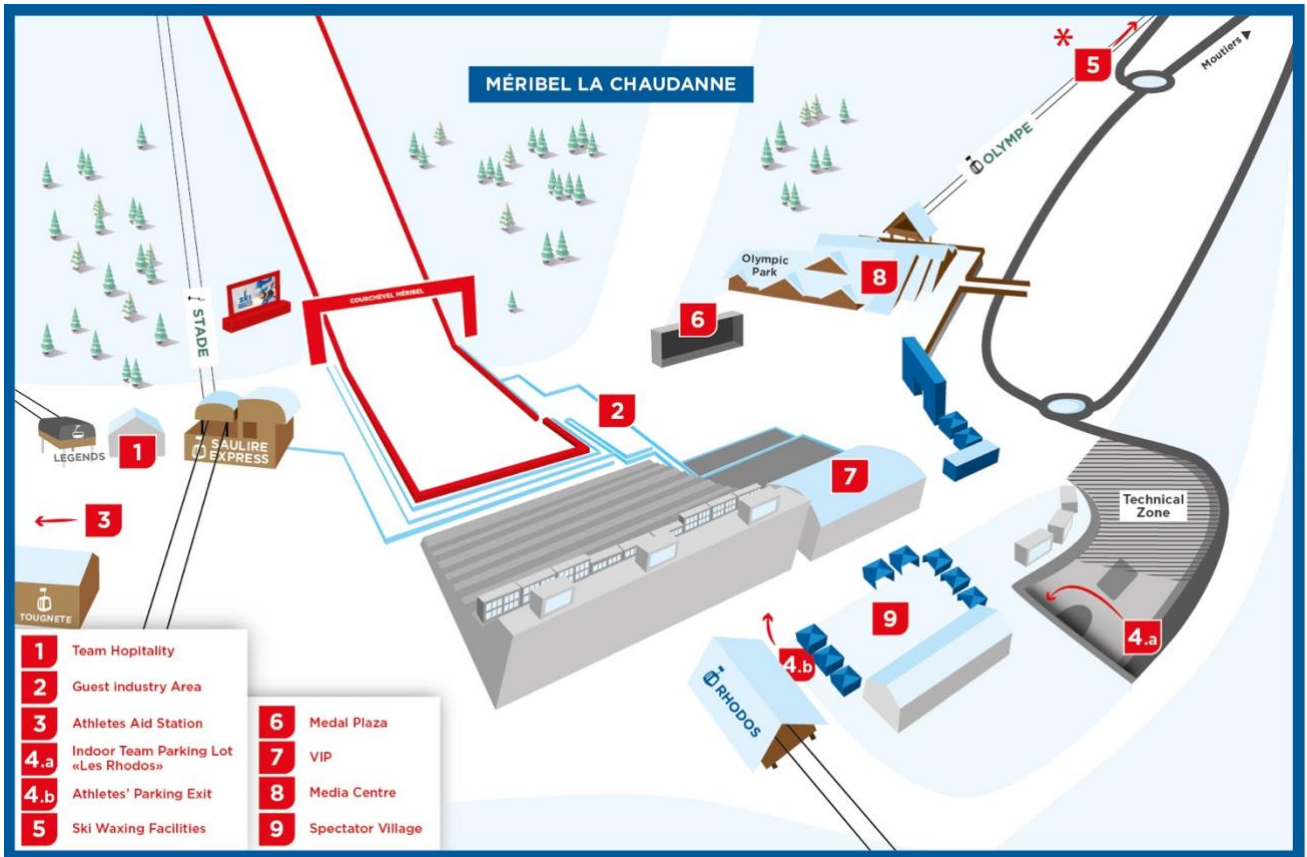

8.2. SKI PREPARATION AND WAXING FACILITIES

Each team will be allocated one or more ski waxing rooms, depending of the number of athletes, according to its accommodation location. Waxing rooms are non-transferrable between teams.

According to the FIS rules, there will be 2 workstations in one ski waxing room (15sqm).

ACCOMMODATION IN COURCHEVEL

Waxing facilities are located in Courchevel le Praz, in the Alpinium parking at the foot of the slopes and the ski lifts. See the finish area map above.

ACCOMMODATION IN MÉRIBEL

Waxing facilities are located in Méribel on a dedicated parking, 300 meters away from the competition slopes and the ski lifts.

Skimen will be able to park at the same location. See the finish area map above.

ACCOMMODATION IN BRIDES-LES-BAINS

Waxing facilities are located in Brides-les-Bains. Stalls with partitions will be built in the *Dova* room.

The exact location of the ski rooms will be sent to each team prior to the event.

8.3. LIFT ACCESS

During training and competition, priority access is given to the competitors, coaches, team personnel and officials on all lifts serving the respective runs. Follow the signs.

8.4. COURSE ACCESS

Access to the competition courses is defined by the Jury and passes are distributed at the Race Office.

8.5. TEAM HOSPITALITY

The team hospitality tents are for the exclusive use of the teams. Athletes and their staff are allowed to enter only on the days they participate in a race. Food and beverages will be provided before and during the races in the two team hospitality tents. The Méribel Team Hospitality area will be located on the left side of the *Saulire* gondola lift and the Courchevel Team Hospitality area will be located in between the Race Office and the lake in Courchevel Le Praz. See the finish area maps above. For the qualifications, a dedicated team hospitality will be set in The Club des Sports Building in Courchevel 1850, at the bottom of Emile Allais Stadium.

8.6. ACCREDITATION

Team Registration takes place at the Race Office in Courchevel Le Praz, from 7:00 to 20:00 (TBC). In case of early arrival, accreditation pick-up will be available on request. Every NSA should have a person responsible for collecting all badges and passes for the team in order to minimize the number of people at the Race Office.

Accreditation datas will be collected through the FIS entries.

Accreditation requests for all SRS staff must be submitted by the corresponding company, not by the NSA.

Accreditation can only be issued in accordance with quota regulations. Up to 50% of the above number of Alpine team official accreditations may be exchanged during the championships in order to accommodate different coaches and support staff in the different events. The accreditation card of the departed official must be returned to the LOC in exchange for a new one.

8.7. PARKING FOR TEAMS

Parking places are available at hotels or in other official parking lots. Detailed information will be sent together with accommodation information.

In the racing areas, the number of allocated parking spots will depend on the team size. Parking passes will be given to team captains at the Race Office.

Access will not be granted without a pass.

8.8. VISA REQUEST AND INFORMATION

We are encouraging all World Championships attendees to start researching their VISA acquisition process now. Citizens of several participating countries are allowed to entry without a visa. If your nation does not fall within the above parameters, please visit your respective embassy website to understand your wait time. This can be a complicated and time-consuming process. 8.10. DOCTORS' MEETING

A first Team Doctors' Meeting will be held on Monday, 6th February, at 8:45 in Méribel, during the first training inspection for women and on Tuesday, 7th February, at 8:45 in Courchevel for men. It will take place in the finish areas.

8.11. RADIO

All the Ski Federations interested in using any radio frequency equipment in France, must apply and obtain a temporary license from the French Authority. Teams must apply a request to obtain a temporary licence to use the radio channels, and complete the payment according to the number of channels required.

The Organizing Committee will coordinate all the frequency control on the equipment. During this process, all the radio devices adopted by the teams for the event will be labelled with a sticker. These labels will uniquely identify the devices allowed to be used during the event, and will be assigned before the start of the World Championships.

A dedicated form will be sent to the NSA September 15th and will have to be returned by December 15th.

8.12. PERSONAL SECURITY

Please notify the LOC staff if any of your athletes, staff, dignitaries or other accredited guests are bringing personal security for the Championships. The Organizing Committee is committed to safe and secure Championships, so we must coordinate all security details and efforts during the event.

8.13. TICKETS AND HOSPITALITY

All athletes will get two tickets (guest industry area) for each competition in which they are competing. The tickets will be given at the race office to the team leaders.

8.14. INTERNET ACCESS

Free Wifi is available for teams in the hospitality tents and in the finish areas.

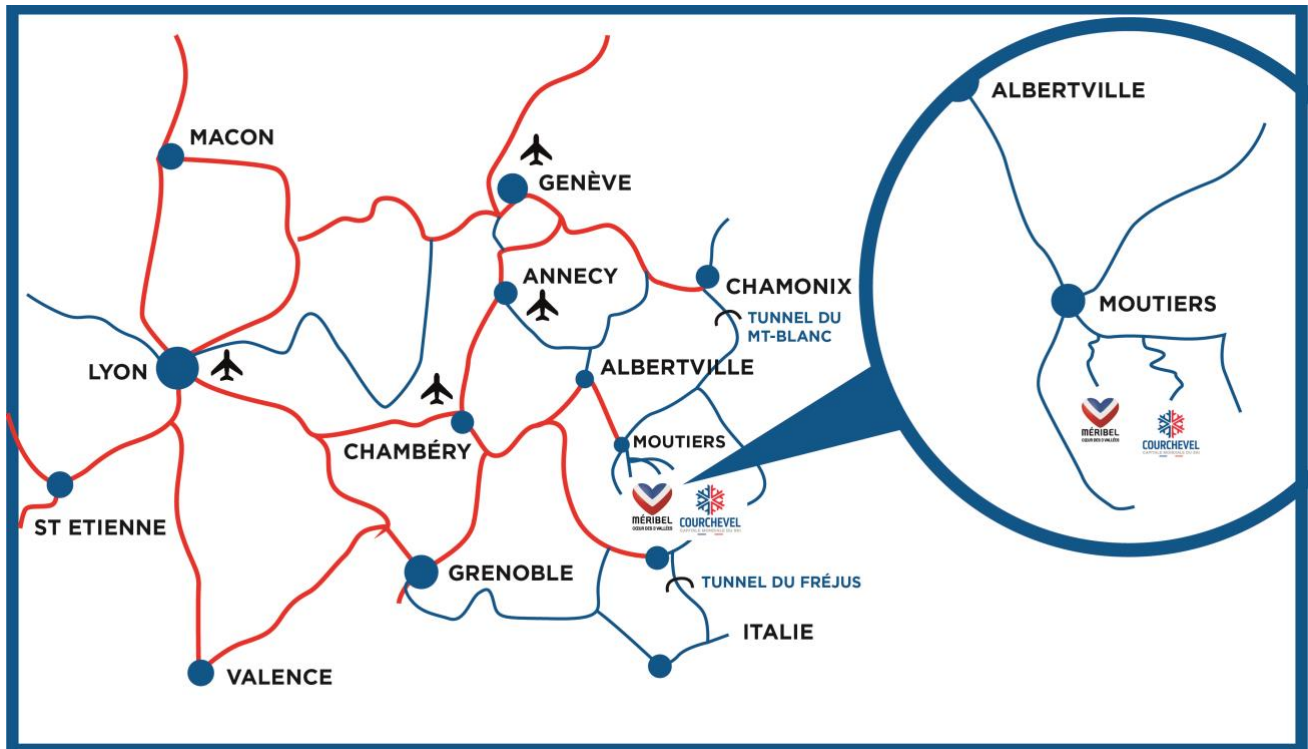

BY PLANE:

There are four airports near Courchevel and Méribel :

- Geneva-Cointrin airport - 149 km (2h15)

Take the A43 highway to Albertville. Then, take the RN90 freeway to Moûtiers. From Moûtiers, drive on D91A and D915 for 25 km to reach Courchevel and on D90 for 18km to reach Méribel.
